Stephen was delighted that two of our bellringers featured in the ART awards this year.

Tower Captain, Debbie Phipps Won the 'ART Award for Inspiring Leadership in Ringing' having been nominated by Alan Bentley. This award is for individuals who create and deliver a long term vision for their bell ringing community, alongside imaginative and inspiring leadership. The judges wanted to understand the barriers and challenges that have been overcome and what was instrumental in making the leader successful – including insights into the specific leadership skills that made the difference and reflections on what others can learn.
